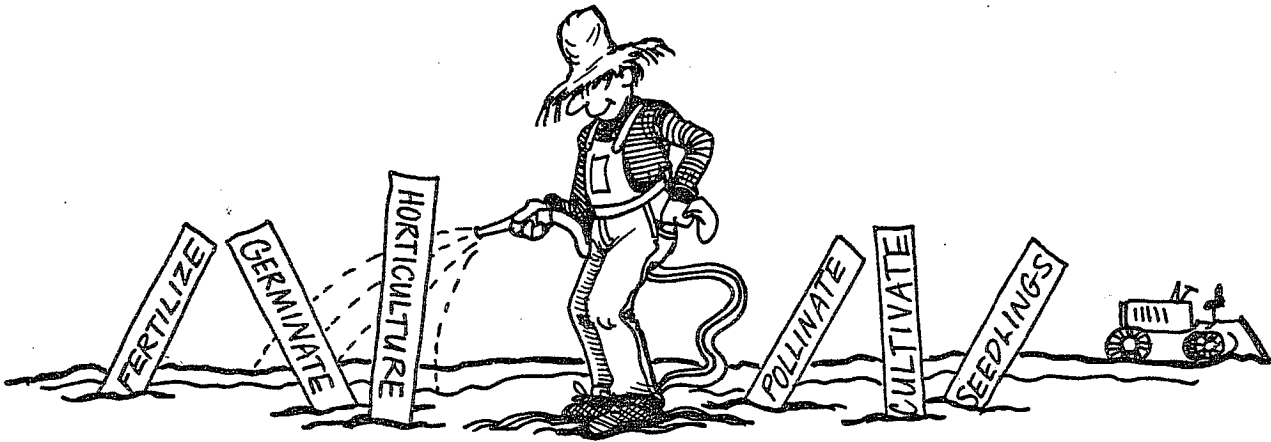

# AT THE ROOT OF IT

You may not think of words as living things with roots. But roots are places from which words grow—sort of like plants. Words have roots as the “center” of their structure, and often other parts, such as prefixes, endings, and suffixes, are added on.
